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**ALIX PEARLSTEIN**—A diverting show of amusing, intentionally fragile art works—a piece of string suspended from the ceiling and pinned to the floor by a life-size plastic finger, for example, and a tree branch held in place by the leashes of three toy dachshunds. But the works' themes—annoyance, temptation, rote behavior—are more pointed. Perhaps the most penetrating work is a videotape of a mechanical dog, in all sorts of settings, juxtaposed with people imitating it.
